
# A Little Fund Raising

#### **Hallam Observatory Site**

**Directions:** The map above shows the Comber area and it includes the major highways (401, 77, 8 and 46) that are in the area of the observatory.

The most direct route from Windsor is "highlighted" on the map which is to take 401 East to Highway 77 South to South Middle Road. While on South Middle Road you go about 1 kilometer and just after the barely discernable point where Concession 9 joins it you will find the observatory site on the South side of the road.

If you hit the Rochester Townline Road (i.e. you come to a stop sign and have to turn left or right) you have gone too far.

# **MEETING MINUTES**

# September 16th 2008 as recorded and compiled by Dave Panton

Pierre welcomed members back from a great Summer. Minutes from the June meeting were read and accepted after a motion by Susan Sawyer-Beaulieu seconded by Rick Marian. The main program for the evening was not available. Reports from member's activities over the summer were featured in lieu of same.

Paul Pratt's photos of Sagittarius and the Milky Way during the Persied meteor shower were shown along with the sole meteor he caught after dozens of exposures. A unique shot by Steve Mastellotto featured the Hallam warm room in the foreground and a new Moon in the West forming the end of a straight line containing Mars, Saturn and the star Regulus. This photograph was the featured RASC photo of the Month. Mike Mastronardi ran a 2 minute video promoting the International Year of Astronomy 2009.

Pierre reported the Point Pelee combined RASC Windsor Centre/Friends of Point Pelee observing session on the West Beach was a great success and thanked all who helped, giving special thanks to Paul Pratt for organizing the affair. The event raised \$260 for Windsor Centre.

The Pelee Island Winery event was also a great success although the sky was not as spectacular. Many members volunteered their time, telescopes and talents for 50 guests. It was sellout and raised \$930. Both these events may be held again in 2009. Pierre also suggested a star party be held on Pelee Island in 2009.

Al Des Rosier has organized an RASC Windsor Centre fund raising garage sale from his home on busy Lesperance Rd. Sept. 20th and 21st. Members have already donated many valuable and highly salable items.

Art Rae brought a CD featuring a variety of NASA video clips from the recent close Cassini spacecraft flyby of Saturn's Moon Iapetus.

#### Light Pollution Abatement: Dan Taylor

The new Home Depot outlet on Division Rd. West of Walker has some non compliant lighting. Dave Panton reported on his less than fruitful efforts with the City building department. Dan asked for additional assistance from members.

Susan has written to the DRIC project team to ensure all lighting will be the FCO type. She also contacted LaSalle authorities suggesting all the cobra head street lights be replaced with FCO fixtures.

Dan circulate a petition to discourage the Dakota Dunes Casino in Saskatchewan from shining their inverted light teepee up into the night sky. He also mentioned suggestions for better lighting can be made by individuals, sighting a single successful call he made to the MTO. Newly installed glare type lights on highway 3 were quickly changed to FCO fixtures.

The shopping development near Ojibway Park is a new concern. He and Mike Mastronardi will work to encourage FCO lighting. Dan also mentioned an all-sky survey pending in Canada. Light pollution will be measured from the ground using Sky Quality Meters.

#### Coffee Break and 50/50 Draw

Tom Sobocan brought in his usual collection of delicious goodies and served them with hot chocolate and coffee. The 50/50 draw was held and the meeting resumed. Pierre introduced three new members, Ken Williams, Brian Lake and Don Bondy.

# Solar Cycle 24

From the ARRL Propagation Report

Wondering when Cycle 24 will begin?

It seems like we've been at solar minimum forever. In fact, there have been several news releases hinting that this solar minimum period between Cycle 23 and 24 is unusual.

The analysis of recent spotless days compared to historical spotless days (see http://science.nasa.gov/headlines/y2008/11jul\_solarcycleupdate.htm) led Dr. David Hathaway (NASA solar physicist) to conclude that nothing is unusual about this solar minimum period. Another way to look at solar minimum is to look at the duration when the smoothed sunspot number is below 20. Historically this duration has ranged from a short 17 months to a long 96 months, with an average of 37 months.

Cycle 23 descended below 20 in February 2006, and Cycle 24 is predicted to ascend above 20 in early 2009. That's around 36 months, so everything appears to be pretty normal so far and agrees with Dr. Hathaway's conclusion. We'll just have to be patient until Cycle 24 starts ramping up. The good news is that we have seen three sunspot regions tied to Cycle 24 (January 4, April 13, and May 5), so it's coming.
